USER GUIDE

Unshielded 68-Pin Screw Terminal Accessory




Figure 1. TBX-68 Parts Locator Diagram

The NI TBX-68, shown in Figure 1, is an unshielded I/O accessory with 68 screw terminals for easy signal connection to a National Instruments 68-pin DAQ device.



Note The TBX-68 accessory is excluded from the scope of the low-voltage directive (LVD) and electromagnetic compatibility (EMC) directive. The CE marking indicates compliance with the RoHS directive 2011/65/EU.

What You Need to Get Started

To set up and use your TBX-68, you need the following:

- □ TBX-68 accessory kit(s)¹
- □ Compatible 68-pin DAQ device and device documentation
- \Box The correct cable(s) for your device
- \Box 0.125 in. flathead screwdriver
- □ 12-30 AWG wire
- □ Wire cutters
- □ Wire insulation stripper

Getting Started with the TBX-68

Remove all cables from the TBX-68 before getting started. If you have not already installed your DAQ device, refer to the installation guide that came with your DAQ device for instructions. Complete the following steps to set up the TBX-68.

- 1. (Optional) Mount the TBX-68 to a standard 35 mm DIN rail using the attached clip on the back of the accessory.
- 2. Connect the wires to the screw terminals by stripping 6 mm (0.25 in.) of insulation, inserting the wires into the screw terminals, and securely tightening the screws with the flathead screwdriver to a torque of $0.8 \text{ N} \cdot \text{m}$ (7 lb \cdot in.). Refer to your device documentation for the DAQ device pinout and signal information.



Caution Do *not* connect input voltages >30 V_{rms}/42 V_{pk}/60 VDC to the TBX-68. The TBX-68 is not designed for any input voltages >30 V_{rms}/42 V_{pk}/60 VDC, even if a user-installed voltage divider reduces the voltage to within the input range of the DAQ device. Input voltages >30 V_{rms}/42 V_{pk}/60 VDC can damage the TBX-68, all devices connected to it, and the host computer.



Caution Do not use for measurements within Categories II, III, or IV.

- 3. Connect the TBX-68(s) to the DAQ device using the appropriate cable(s) for your device.
- Launch Measurement & Automation Explorer (MAX). In the left panel, expand Devices and Interfaces to confirm that your DAQ device is recognized, and then configure your device settings.
- 5. Test specific device functionality. Run a Test Panel in MAX by right-clicking your DAQ device and selecting **Test Panels**. Click **Start** to test the device functions.

When you have finished using the TBX-68, power off any external signals connected to the TBX-68 before you power off your computer.

¹ You can use up to two TBX-68 accessories with M/X Series devices with two connectors.
